

Industry Participation Advisory Panels

The Advisory Panels are established by the Office of the Industry Advocate (OIA). It is intended that the Advisory Panels be a forum for discussing proposed procurement and contracting matters, practices and policies that impact the relevant sector.

There are six Advisory Panels covering the various industry sectors and an Innovation Think Tank:

- Advanced Technologies Advisory Panel
- Building and Construction Advisory Panel
- Creative Industries Advisory Panel
- Goods and Services Advisory Panel
- Major Projects Advisory Panel
- Professional Services Advisory Panel
- Innovation Think Tank

Terms of Reference are as follows:

The panels are established by the Office of the Industry Advocate (OIA). The purpose of the panels is to recommend to the IPA:

- Reforms to government practices and processes (including procurement) to ensure local businesses are not disadvantaged and the benefits of buying locally are taken into account when assessing the relative value of applications from local businesses.
- New ways to drive local investment, develop strong value chains from the State's annual spend on construction and building and leverage opportunities for innovation.
- All panels will consider opportunities and impediments associated with State Government projects and contracts in their specified field.

The panels are non-statutory advisory committees established for an initial term ending 30 June 2015, or earlier at the IPA's discretion.

Membership of the panel

Panel members will be appointed by the IPA. Membership is attached to the individual rather than their positions.

Membership will include at least one (1) member with recent and relevant industry experience in areas determined by the IPA.

The IPA will chair the Advisory Panel. With the agreement of members, government officials, industry representatives or relevant experts may be invited to attend meetings as advisers or observers and may contribute to discussion.

If a vacancy or vacancies arise, or certain members are not available for a particular meeting, the panel may continue provided there is a quorum of four (4) members. For all members of the panel it is a voluntary position and members will not be reimbursed for any costs associated with their participation.

Confidentiality

It is intended that the Advisory Panel be a forum for discussing proposed procurement and contracting matters, practices and policies that impact the relevant industry sector.

It is envisaged that members may be provided with information that is not available to the public. Given the level of confidentiality that will be associated with information provided to members, any discussion and consultation with non-Advisory Panel members must be limited to information already available to the relevant industry sector.

Confidential Advisory Panel discussions must not be disclosed without the Chair's prior approval.

Conflicts of Interest

Members must have knowledge and expertise in their relevant industry sector and are appointed to the panel for the purpose of providing expert advice in relation to matters before the panel. Given the pool of potential members in South Australia with the necessary expertise and experience is not large, there is a potential for a conflict of interest to arise from time to time.

Members must report a conflict of interest or apparent conflict of interest to the Chair at the commencement of the meeting or as soon as practicable after the member becomes aware that a conflict of interest or apparent conflict of interest may exist.

- *A conflict of interest will arise if a person's personal interests (whether financial or not) conflict with their duties as a panel member such that the person may not be independent, objective and impartial in relation to those duties. An apparent conflict of interest will arise if a conflict of interest may be perceived by a reasonable observer, whether or not there is an actual conflict of interest.*

Secretariat support

The Office of the Industry Advocate will provide secretariat support to the panel.
